3.1. First Nation Board Members

Chair Donald Sanderson noted that since his report was circulated with the Agenda, notice had been received of Wasauksing First Nation's appointment of Councillor Chance Pedoniquotte-King to the Board, Councillor Lindsay McConnell as alternate, and Director of Health Deborah Pegahmagabow to the Steering Committee. Mr. Sanderson also reported that he was scheduled to present to Shawanaga First Nation tomorrow, with hopes of an appointment from Shawanaga in the near future.

3.6 Branding Strategy / Website Development

In response to member inquiries, SC Vice Chair Jason Inwood reported that industry practice is to issue an RFP, with local bidders welcome to make submission alongside out-of-area businesses, but that no preference or weight is given to local bidders.

SC Vice Chair Inwood also reported that the \$30,000 is to cover branding, identity, logo, marketing materials – important pieces to “sell” the project in the funding/sponsorship campaign. Branding is not an eligible expense under the grant received, and the expectation is to borrow the money and pay it back when sponsorship funds have been received. An alternative is for each municipality to contribute their calculated allocation.

3.9 Update on acquisition of property

SC Chair Harris reported as previously advised to the Wellness Centre & Pool Committee, that the YMCA is prepared to donate the land. A Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is currently being finalized regarding transfer of the land to the Board and should be completed by the end of the first or second quarter.

Several board members urged the Steering Committee to get a binding contract with the YMCA no later than the end of the first quarter.

3.10 Meaning of “Culture” within Name of Facility and Board

Councillor Pedoniquotte-King asked what the word “Culture” within context of the name of the facility and the Board, means to the Board, and whether there was additional funding received as a result of including First Nations in the funding application.

Responses included reference to a community’s story, history, roots, and to a proposal to mount the text of the Robinson-Huron Treaty at the facility. With respect to funding received relevant to First Nations, Chair Sanderson clarified that the intent in his recent presentation to Wasauksing First Nation was to express that the funding application made jointly by the area municipalities and First Nations was stronger.

Councillor Pedoniquotte-King said that he didn’t want “culture” to be in the name as a token, but as something authentic, and that he wants to make sure the work is heading in the right direction for future generations.

3.11 Chair and Vice-Chair Appointment

Chair Sanderson reported that he and the Vice Chair hoped to be able to execute on behalf of the Board, the Agreement for ICIP funding before year end, and that the Board might deal with the appointment of Chair and Vice Chair at the next Board meeting expected to be scheduled by the end of the first quarter.
